Assemblies

Over the next two weeks the children will be exploring the following themes:

Perfect Promises: Presence - God has promised His people throughout history that He will be close to them. This assembly explores the Old Testament concept of God's presence residing in the Temple and helps children consider that they are temples where God dwells with them today.

Perfect Promises: Belonging - In this final assembly of our Lent series reflecting on God's Perfect Promises, children hear Jeremiah's prophecy declaring that God's people will find belonging when His law is written on their hearts. The prayer time this week invites children to remember that they belong to God and He loves them.

Enterprise Sales

Each class made and sold a product as part of Enterprise Week. The money raised by the sales will be split between the Lighthouse Project and Dr Kershaw's Hospice. So far we have raised £263. Thank you for supporting school with this event.

On Friday 22 March at 2:15pm school will be holding an information workshop with a focus on the 'Cost of Living.' This Caritas workshop is a guide for parents to help you save money. Caritas Salford have specialist energy advisors for help around saving money on household bills, including small immediate measures that can be taken to improve efficiency and reduce the cost of bills. Thomas and Mahan have Level 3 City and Guilds qualifications in energy advice. Their presentation will cover a brief overview of the types of advice and support that they can offer, as well as immediate tips you can take home. There will be some time for questions as well.

This will be useful for you if you wish to reduce gas and electric bills without access or eligibility for larger schemes; struggle to understand your utility bills and meters; or have issues with condensation, damp, or, mould.

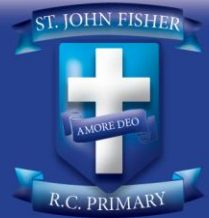
